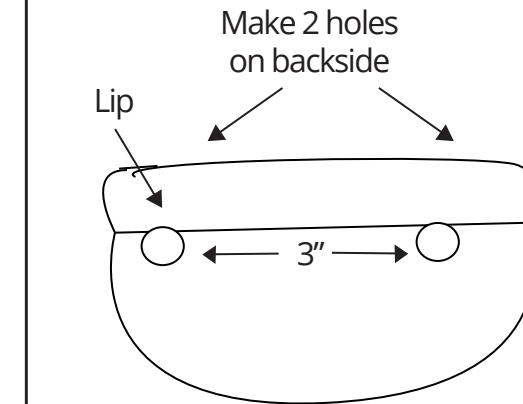
PREP INSTRUCTIONS:

For each bird feeder you will need: 1 foam bowl, four 15" pieces of hemp cord and assorted pieces of tissue paper strips.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Choose which color or colors of tissue paper that you will use. You may cut into 1" pieces or use whole strips.
2. Brush on decoupage and apply on the tissue paper pieces or strips to the foam bowl. Continue until the outside of the foam bowl is covered. Let dry. Repeat with the inside of the foam bowl. Let dry.
3. Starting at one point under the lip of the foam bowl, mark it with a pencil. Do the 2nd one 3 inches away. Repeat 2 more times. (see Figure A).
4. Poke the pencil through the pencil marks to the inside of the foam bowl. Repeat with the other 3 pencil marks (see Figure A).
5. Take one 15" piece of hemp cord and poke one end through one hole. Tie a knot. Repeat with the other 3 pieces of hemp cord (see Figure B).
6. Take all four ends of the cord and tie into one knot (see Figure B).

Raku is a form of handmade Japanese pottery, used most often as small bowls.
