Sand Art Bottle Easy Pack

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING



YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- 24 Bottles with corks
- 16 lbs. fine sand
- 24 Funnels

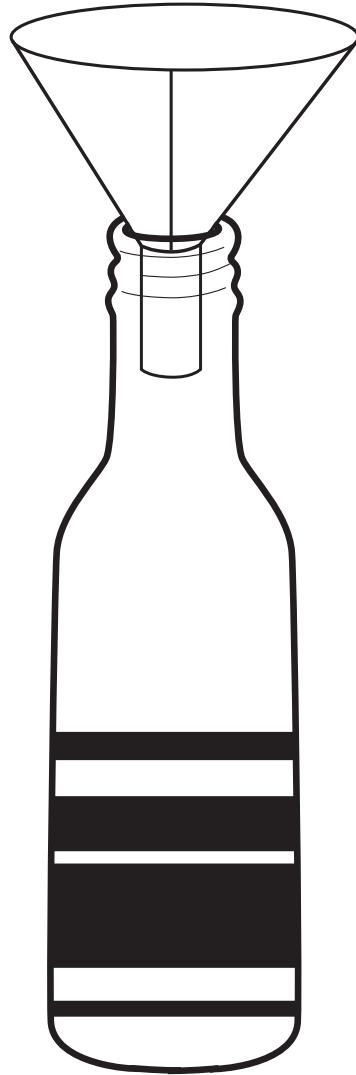
YOU WILL NEED:

- Ruler or wooden spoon

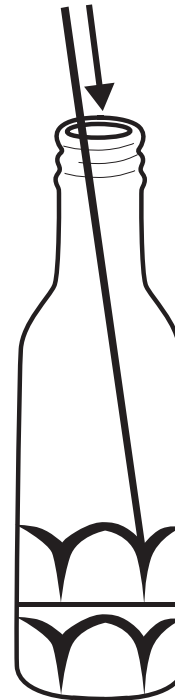
AGE GROUP: 4 and up

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Always start with a clean, dry bottle and cover the work area with a clean sheet of paper.
2. Snip a corner off of the sand bags, place a funnel into the bottle opening and while pouring slowly, begin layering sand one color at a time.
3. Try to keep layers at least 1/4" thick so that the colors make the distinct layers. Varying the depth of the layers will make your sand art more interesting. You can alternate colors and use as many colors as you choose. Each sand art bottle will be unique and beautiful.
4. Occasionally tap side of bottle to pack sand more tightly. Use a ruler or wooden spoon. Do not shake the bottle as this will cause the sand layers to mix.
5. Continue filling all the way to the top, tape the side again and top it off with sand.
6. Place a cork in the opening to close.



You can create diagonal layers by holding the bottle at an angle as you fill it. Experiment with different angles in your sand art. If the bottle is resting on its base, horizontal layers will be created.



Unique layers can be made using a wood skewer (or something similar) to push between layers allowing the sand to fill in the indentation. Insert the skewer into the bottle and press it against the inside. Carefully push the point down through the layers. As you draw the skewer back up and out of the bottle, the sand from the different layers will fill in creating a wonderful effect.
