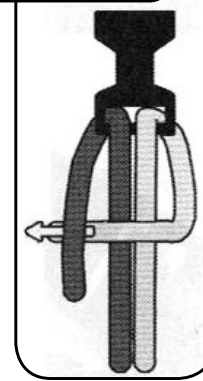
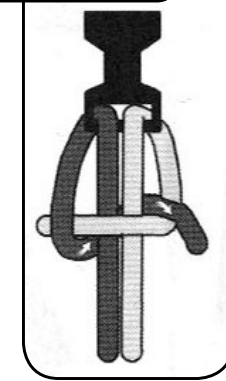
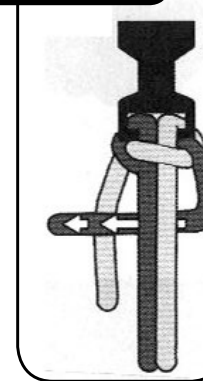
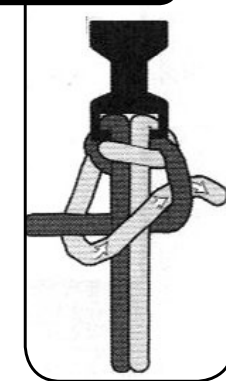
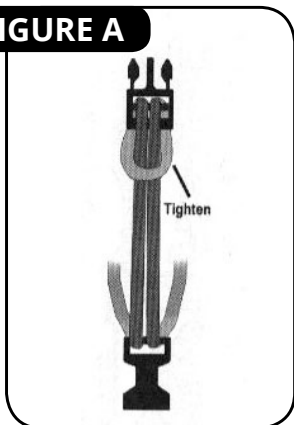
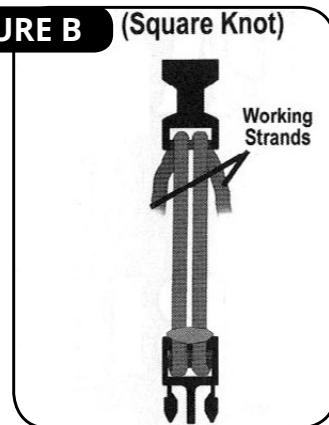
AGE GROUP: 8 and up
PROJECT TIME: 20 minutes

YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Strong Glue

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Measure and cut a piece of cord 8 feet long.
2. Fold the cord in half to find the center. Feed the center through the first half of the clip and pull the strands through the center as shown (see Figure A). If it is difficult to thread the center fold into the clip, then try to thread one end at a time and pull the cord until centered on the clip. Pull the ends through the loop and pull down tight.
3. Feed the ends of the cord through the second half of the clip as shown (see Figure A). Slide the clip down the cord so that it is held 6 to 6.5 inches away from the first clip. Adjust to your wrist size as needed (see Figure B).
4. Make square knots (see Figures C, D, E and F). Make the last stitch good and tight.
5. Trim the remaining cord to leave only about 1/8 inch away from the last knot (see Figure G).
6. Apply glue to the knot, especially at the base of the last knot created and to the end of the cord. Allow to dry.
