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

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INSTRUCTIONS

- 1** Begin by knotting the end of the yarn and slipping it into the groove near number 21 on the loom. Hold the yarn and wrap it around the post #21 in a counterclockwise direction toward you. Continue to wrap around each post counterclockwise, all the way to the other end of the loom. Keep the yarn loose as you go. If wrapped tightly, it will be harder to move it later.
- 2** Wrapping twice around post #32, wrap around each post again, this time going clockwise around each one, moving back toward post #21 (keep this row loose too). Anchor the yarn tail into the groove to hold it in place. Beginning at post #21, take the tool and insert it into the vertical groove in the post and grab the first loop of yarn, (the one closest to the wood base), pulling it up and over the second loop and off the loom. As you go along each post, push the remaining loop down close to the wood base, and go on to the next post. Continue all the way to the other end of the loom.
- 3** Pick up the tail of yarn and wrap the posts again, starting at the first post and wrapping in a counterclockwise direction.
- 4** Continue to go back and forth, wrapping the loom counterclockwise when you go from #21 to #32 and clockwise when you move from #32 toward #21. Between each time you wrap the yarn on the posts, you use the hook to move the loops off the loom. After you have finished about 4 rows, remove the beginning knot from the groove and let it hang down on the finished piece.

- 6** To remove your piece from the loom, cut the tail of yarn approx. 2 ft. Thread this tail onto a large needle and weave it through each loop on the loom. Pull the stitches off the loom and lay the piece flat to even out the edge. Then tie a knot in the end of the tail and weave it into the finished piece.

SCARF: Vary the length as desired.

Using any color, fill your loom and weave until the desired length of the scarf. If you want a narrow scarf, use only some of the pegs and leave the rest empty.

The scarf can be made of many colors by just changing the color as the knitting proceeds.

Change colors at the beginning of a row. Using the tail end of the old color, tie a knot at the edge with the new color. The tails of the knot can be woven into the scarf later.

Keep track of how many rows are being made of each color, in order to know when to repeat a color.

Scarf Fringe: Wrap about 40 wraps around a book or piece of cardboard. Make a cut in the wraps. Using a threaded needle or a crochet hook, thread 2 or 3 strands of these cut pieces into the bottom edge of the scarf. Repeat across the edge until it is filled in. Repeat on the other edge of the scarf.

For more fun, sew large pompoms of the yarn onto the edges of the scarf, instead of fringe.
