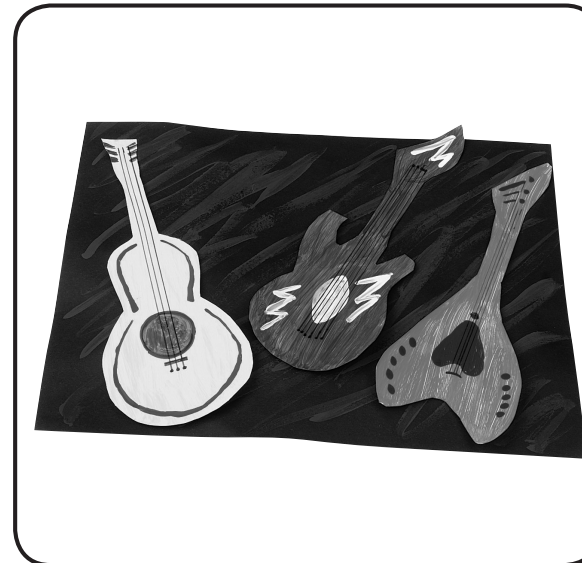

3-D Guitars Kit (Pk/12)

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING



YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Black Background Paper
- Gray Paper
- White Guitar Shapes
- Fluorescent Paint
- Brushes

AGE GROUP: 6 and up
PROJECT TIME: 45 minutes

YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Water
- Paper Towels
- Glue
- 3-D Glasses (PY1495)

PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Distribute supplies so that each person has one sheet of black paper for the background, one sheet of gray paper, and 3 different guitar shapes.
2. Paint black paper, if desired, but keep it simple as this is just the background. Set aside to dry.
3. Paint your 3 guitar shapes. Then paint the rockstar guitars as radical as possible. Use your imagination.
4. Allow time for the shapes to dry. While wet, the shapes may curl. They will lie flat again when dry.
5. While waiting, cut your gray paper into strips lengthwise, about 1/2" wide. You may use your strips of paper in many different ways, such as: Take 2 strips and hold them perpendicular to each other. Fold one over the top of the other and alternate folding each strip over the other one, which creates an accordion. If you use short strips, folded in this manner, they can be glued to the back side of the guitar to make it "pop off the page". The accordion folded paper acts like a spring to make the guitar appear to be moving.
6. Use your paper strips to create a picture frame for your guitar. Try thinking how to make stairs, a house frame, music bars and notes, etc. Let our imagination be your guide.
7. Glue all the shapes and strips onto the paper after the paint is dry and then view your creation through 3-D glasses (PY1495) to see them pop off the page.
8. With or without the 3-D glasses, this project rocks!
